Overview

McREL's two-day Success in Sight workshop provides school leadership teams a structured process in which they can develop a new kind of school improvement plan.



Unlike many school improvement plans that try to do too much, ignore school culture, miss the root causes of student under-performance, and use data to identify what to do, but fail to make explicit how it will be done and who will do it, leadership teams will keep “success in sight” while creating a customized plan for their school. Working with their own data, they will identify areas of strengths and areas of needed improvement; set focused goals to address those needs; and identify concrete, manageable strategies for achieving them.

A New Approach to School Improvement Planning

- The importance of asking why and digging deep into data to guide change and assess progress;
- Where research says schools should focus their efforts;
- How quick wins can begin to transform a school's culture, create a “can do” attitude, or sense of “collective efficacy” among staff; and
- How to “think systemically, yet act systematically,” starting with small, manageable changes that grow into larger, more comprehensive efforts.

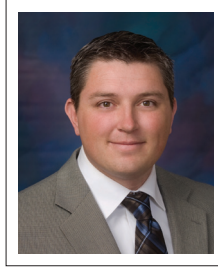
