

Resource mapping is a way to determine your school’s capacity for providing interventions. Resources are the materials and programs, as well as the skills, experience, training, and knowledge of staff members. By evaluating the available resources within a building, schools can efficiently establish standard practices for students needing specific predictable interventions, as well as establish the availability of other interventions for the more intensive needs at Tiers 2 and 3. Resource mapping is also very helpful in determining where there are gaps in available resources.

This tool should help schools map out what interventions they have available for different areas of need, and to help communicate with staff to know what might be most appropriate to address their students’ needs.
